

FAMILY MEDIATION FEES, VOUCHERS & LEGAL AID.

1. Family Mediation Fees

Mediation Plus offers cost effective private family mediation. Family mediation is made up of two different types of meeting.

- a) an initial Mediation Information and Assessment Meeting (MIAM) of up to 45 minutes
- b) and, if deemed suitable, one or more mediation sessions of 90 minutes each

The cost of these services are;

Mediation Information and Assessment Meeting (MIAM)	£95 per person
Mediation Session (joint or shuttle)	£150 per person
Preparation of a Memorandum of Understanding, if needed	£150 per person
Child Consultation, if needed	£ 50

*Please note that we do not charge VAT and our fees include all administration.

2. Family Mediation Vouchers Available worth £500.

You may be eligible for a government funded family mediation voucher to cover up to £500 towards the cost of mediation. This is not means tested and it does not cover the cost of your MIAM.

Your mediator will access your case for eligibility and the voucher normally covers;

- a dispute / application regarding a child
- a dispute/application regarding family finance matters where you are also involved in a dispute / application relating to a child.

3. Cancellation and Non-Attendance Policy - All Clients

If an appointment is cancelled and you give at least **three working days'** notice, you may re-book at no extra charge. However, if you do not wish to re-book, then an administration fee of £35 will be deducted from your payment and the balance refunded.

If an appointment is not attended or is cancelled with less than the required notice the following administration fees apply:

MIAM appointment	£35.00 per person
Mediation Session	£75.00 per person

Legal Aid

If you think you or your ex-partner may be entitled to legal aid funding, which will cover the cost of family mediation, we recommend you use the gov.uk website to [check your eligibility](#) and to [find a legal aid provider](#). **This is not something we offer.**

As a rough guide, you may be eligible for legal aid support if you or your ex-partner are on certain benefits, have a household income of less than £2,657 per month (if you live with a partner, their income will be calculated in this), and have savings of under £8,000.
